Lie or Lay?

“**Lie**” means to rest flat, to recline, to stay in a place, and also to speak untruth.

As a noun, “**lie**” means untruth.

“**Lay**” is to put down something or someone carefully, or in case of animals or birds, it means to produce eggs. It is also the past simple tense of “**lie**” meaning to recline.

Now let's look at the conjugation.

Present simple	Past simple	Present participle	Past participle
lie (to recline)	lay	lying	lain
lie (to speak untruth)	lied	lying	lied
lay	laid	laying	laid
