inequality. She was a supporter of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s work, and helped King to form the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. It was her work with young people, however, that had the most influence on civil rights. Baker taught young people that their voices were important in affecting change. She emphasized non-violent approaches to protesting inequality, and laid the framework for the SNCC (Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee), an important organization that included mostly college-aged students. These students took part in the Freedom Rides of the early 1960s.

from Columbia University in 1940. This, however, is not his most important achievement. Dr. Drew became a medical authority on blood transfusions and storage just as the world was entering World War II. His extensive research on blood led to new developments in the safe collection, storage, and transfusion of blood and the creation of successful blood banks. These blood banks greatly benefited American troops during the war, even though at this time in history, the U.S. military did not allow African-American blood to be given to white people.
