

Finding Slope: Ratio method

Find the slope of a line passing through $(-2, -1)$ and $(3, 9)$.

$$\Delta y = y_2 - y_1 = 9 + 1 = \mathbf{10}$$

$$\Delta x = x_2 - x_1 = 3 + 2 = \mathbf{5}$$

$$\text{Slope} = \frac{\Delta y}{\Delta x} = \frac{10}{5} = \mathbf{2}$$
