





Demonstrative Pronouns

A **demonstrative pronoun** is used to point to something specific within a sentence. This and these are used for nearby objects, and that and those are used for faraway things. This and that are singular, and these and those are plural.

Example:	Singular	Plural	
 (near)	<u> This </u> is a parrot.	 (near)	<u> These </u> are parrots.
	<u> That </u> is a parrot.  (far)		<u> Those </u> are parrots.  (far)


